2005 Horse Mutilation in France

October 3, 2005 Fessey, Haute-Saone, France - This past weekend I received a translation of a French television news report about a July 8, 2005, unusual mutilation of a horse in Fessey, Haute-Saone, France. The following is the August 7, 2005, France3-TV text with images, as provided:

"French ufologists, up to now, were not accustomed too much to the businesses of animal mutilations which, essentially before, occurred on the American ground. Perhaps, but that is likely to change. Indeed, the France3 chain has just made a report on the mysterious death of a foal in a village of Haute-Saône, "Fessey".

"The owner and her husband initially thought that their foal had been the prey of a dog but, taking into account the characteristics of the wounds (clear, without burs, apparent absence of even coagulated blood), the gendarmes dismissed this assumption. The more so as, in accordance with the American mutilations, the sex of the foal "was also torn off to him" to take again the terms of the éleveuse one.

"Another characteristic which will not fail to interest the ufologists, the owner had found the other horses of the grazing ground all thrown into a panic and

gathered around the foal. It added: "It was the first time that I saw that!".

"A veterinary surgeon was consulted and, as if that were not enough intrigant, declared that the foal had already died before the bites, most probably of the continuations of a stress and a cardiac attack! An autopsy will be carried out. Remain to see whether all will be communicated to us."
